GET YOUR DOCS IN A ROW!

Within Canada's multi-faceted medical system, the ability to accurately and reliably identify individual physicians is more difficult than ever.

Organizations which manage physician databases encounter various challenges such as:

- confirming the identity of physicians (especially when names, credentials and even licence numbers might change over time)
- matching individuals between databases
- comparing or combining information about physicians with information from other databases

Many medical/health organizations have attempted to resolve this by issuing their own identifiers for physicians; the result has been a proliferation of identifiers, none of which is linkable with other organizations. To address these challenges, the Medical Identification Number for Canada (MINC) system was created.

MINCs are:

- unique lifetime identifiers assigned to each individual who enters the Canadian medical education or practice system
- serial numbers with no encoded information (except country and profession)
- nationally-recognized
- supported by the Medical Council of Canada (MCC) and the Federation of Medical Regulatory Authorities of Canada (FMRAC)

MINCs are not:

- a replacement for any existing registration, membership,
- certificate or other identification
 number
- reflective of any status, rights, credentials or privileges



Who operates the MINC system?

MINC#NIMC is a federally incorporated not-for-profit corporation which operates the MINC number system.

MINC#NIMC is owned jointly by the FMRAC and the MCC.

MINCs are generated by MINC#NIMC for each physician who registers with any medical regulatory authority in Canada, or who applies to write MCC exams.

Privacy, confidentiality and security are an important part of MINC's design and operation:

- each medical regulatory authority signs an agreement with MINC#NIMC outlining their respective obligations in the collection, use and disclosure of MINC-related information
- physicians sign a consent form which allows MINC to create a number for them, and for Licensed users to have use of that number
- licensing agreements stress security and confidentiality
- the MINC Privacy Policy is posted on the MINC website at minc-nimc.ca
- a Privacy Impact Assessment has been completed for the MINC system

How can my organization become a MINC user?

Organizations must enter a licensing agreement with MINC#NIMC, and pay a licensing fee. The licensing agreements ensure that:

- organizations will only use MINCs for approved administrative, regulatory or research purposes
- Licensed users use MINCs to exchange information only with other Licensed users
- appropriate security and confidentiality provisions are employed for MINCs and information which may be attached to them
